


SKALA collaborates with other Australia-Indonesia Partnership Programs to Strengthen Inclusive **Governance and Basic Services**

Collaborating for impact



Building inclusive governance and basic services requires collective effort. That is why SKALA works with other Australia–Indonesia partnership programs to strengthen governance systems. These include INKLUSI, the partnership for an inclusive society; INOVASI, the partnership for basic education; and KIAT, the partnership for infrastructure.

Aligning with Indonesia's Development Priorities



SKALA's collaboration with INKLUSI, INOVASI, and KIAT supports inclusive policies through technical assistance and shared expertise, in support of Indonesia's development priorities. This collaboration focuses on four key areas:

- 1. Public Financial Management
- 2. Minimum Service Standards
- 3. Data use and analysis

4. Gender Equality, Disability, and Social Inclusion mainstreaming

National Collaboration for Disability Inclusion Policy



At the national level, SKALA and INKLUSI jointly supported the preparation of the Presidential Report on the implementation of the National Action Plan on Persons with Disabilities 2020– 2024. This contribution is a strategic step towards strengthening policy on disability rights over the next five years.

Innovative Financing for Inclusive Basic Services



Fiscal capacity is essential to ensure the sustainable delivery of basic services. In

collaboration with KIAT, SKALA is exploring an innovative financing model that blends specific fiscal transfers to strengthen local financing for inclusive development.

Evidence-Based Planning for Climate Adaptation Action



In SKALA's partner provinces, the impacts of climate change are already being felt. In collaboration with UN Global Pulse Asia Pacific, SKALA will use the analysis of sea level rise data to support provincial governments integrate climate risks into development planning, to inform the design of climate-resilient basic services.

GEDSI Mainstreaming in Regional Policy in North Kalimantan



In North Kalimantan, SKALA, INKLUSI, and INOVASI are working together to mainstream GEDSI principles into regional policy frameworks. This includes support for the Regional Action Plan for Persons with Disabilities, the Out-of-School Children Action Plan, and efforts to strengthen Gender Responsive Planning and Budgeting.

Strengthening Civil Society Participation in Maluku



In Maluku, SKALA partnered with *Rumah Generasi*, INKLUSI's partner, to strengthen civil society participation in public consultations for the Regional Action Plan for Persons with Disabilities. SKALA also supported capacity building through training sessions at the Gender Responsive Planning and Budgeting Clinic in Ambon.

Cross-program collaboration can help close gaps, foster innovation, and expand the impact of the Australia and Indonesia Partnership.
